SUN SAFETY

The school has a **'no hat no play in the sun'** policy. All children must wear a navy-blue broad brim hat each day. Broad brim hats are available from the front office for \$8.00.

HOMEWORK

Children will receive homework on a weekly basis. Homework should be returned to school on Fridays. The children will need coloured pencils at home to complete their homework. The school also has a Home Reading program in which children are encouraged to read every night to a family member.

PARENT/TEACHER MEETINGS & REPORTS

Parent/Teacher meetings take place in Terms 1 & 3. Teachers will write school reports at the end of Terms 2 & 4. These reports show the progress your child is making. The reports are handed to children and are to be opened by an adult when they get home.

NOTES

During the year, children will get notes that need to be signed and sent back to school. Please ensure that these notes are signed and returned to the <u>front office</u> by the due date. If money needs to be sent with a note, please put the note and money in an envelope marked with your child's name, class, and the amount enclosed. We also offer an online payment system accessible from the front page of the school's website by selecting <u>\$Make a payment</u>.

ATTENDANCE

Research shows a clear correlation between student attendance and the achievement of quality outcomes. This research tells us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk. The Department of Education's expected student attendance rate is now above 95%. This equates to no more than two days absent a term. It is important that children attend school every day.

ABSENCE

If your child is sick, it is appropriate to keep them at home. You need to inform the school of the reason for the absence within seven days. This can be done through the Sentral Parent Portal app, a phone call to the school office, or by sending a note of explanation to the class teacher on the next day your child attends school. If your child is sick for more than two days, we require a medical certificate to explain the absence.

SICK CHILDREN

If your child becomes ill or injured at school, they will be supervised in sickbay. Minor ailments will be attended to, and your child will return to class. You will be contacted if your child has a more serious ailment.

CANTEEN

Currently, our School Canteen is non-operational.

BREAKFAST CLUB

A Breakfast Club offering toast and cereal operates from the Lambert Street room every day from 8:30am – 8:55am. Any child from K-6 can access the Breakfast Club.

BUS

Bus travel is free for all students in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 and for all children in Years 3 to 6 if living more than 1.6 kilometres from the school. It is suggested that parents of young children bring them to and from school, or travel on the bus with them until they are sure of their destination. **Parents should skill their children in bus safety before they allow their children to travel.** Information on this can be obtained online at transportnsw.info/school-student. Buses drop off and pick up from the Rocket St side of the school. In the afternoon children wait in lines for their buses under the COLA (covered outdoor learning area).

INFECTIOUS DISEASES

A list of infectious diseases and the amount of time a child is to be kept away from school is set out below, as required by the NSW Department of Health guidelines. If you have any queries about the following medical problems, please consult the local doctor or the Health Centre.

Children must stay away from school while they have these diseases as they are highly contagious.

DISEASE	STAY AT HOME	
Chicken Pox	exclude for 7 days after the first spots appear or until they are fully recovered	
Measles	exclude for 5 days from appearance of rash	
Mumps	exclude for 10 days from the onset of swelling	

Pediculosis

exclude until hair is completely cleaned and all (Head Lice) lice are gone

Conjunctivitis

Impetigo (School Sore) exclude until sores have healed.

COVID-19

exclude until discharge from eyes has ceased

COVID 19 has had a significant impact on how we operate and work globally. The Department of Education utilises the expertise and guidelines put in place by NSW Health to ensure our school is a COVID safe environment. Our school has enhanced cleaning, maintains the 1.5m social distancing requirement, constantly reminds staff, children, and visitors about hygiene practices, and writes COVID safe plans. All visitors must QR code and sign the visitor's book upon entry to the school. If any staff member, child, parent, or visitor has flu-like symptoms, they should not attend the school site. Instead, they should present for a COVID screening test. Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) have been supplied, and parents are encouraged to test children regularly. If children test positive for COVID-19, they should isolate for 7 days.

MEDICATION

If a child must take medicine at school, please inform the office. All medication must go to the front office, where a Request for Administering Prescribed Medication form must to be filled out by the parent/carer. Alternatively, parents/carers should bring the medicine to the school office and administer it as required.

LIBRARY

Children will visit the library for one lesson per week. Here they will learn how to hold books, how to look after books, who authors and illustrators are and will be able to borrow books. Please encourage children to use books at home. Children can also visit the library at break times to read books and play games.

P & C MEETINGS

The Parents' and Citizens' Group meets on the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 7.00 pm in the school staffroom. The P & C assists with fundraising and policy development. Through attendance at these meetings, parents can be informed about school happenings and policies, besides meeting and discussing educational issues with other interested parents. Reminders for meetings appear in the newsletter and are marked on the school calendar.

DROP OFF ZONE

The school drop off zone is situated at the pedestrian entrance on George St, which goes directly into the top playground.

It operates between 8.30 and 9.30 am. Cars pull in parallel to the kerb to let the children out of the car on the kerb side. Once this is completed it is easy to move back out into the flow of traffic along George St. Parents are urged to follow this procedure to assist the road safety of our children.

NAPLAN

During Term 2, all students in Years 3 and 5 undertake the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN Online). This test is administered to all Year 3 and 5 students in Australia. They enable the school to benchmark with other schools and monitor our own students' progress. There are three components: Reading, Language Conventions, Writing and Numeracy. Parents will be provided with a written report on their child's results in Term 3. In addition, parents are welcome to discuss the results with class teachers.

SCHOOL COUNSELLOR

All students in NSW government schools have access to a school counsellor. School counsellors assist students experiencing emotional, psychological, social, and learning problems. In supporting students, school counsellors will also provide advice to parents and teachers as appropriate. If a parent wishes to speak with the school counsellor, an appointment can be made by telephoning the school. Alternatively, parents can request their child see the school counsellor by contacting the school and signing a referral form.

Bathurst Public School has a counsellor 3 days per week. Our counsellors are Ms Anthea Bourne and Ms Emily Boland.

UPDATING INFORMATION

If any details such as your address or phone number change, it is important that you inform the school as soon as possible.

SCRIPTURE (SRE) / ETHICS (SEE)

NSW Public Schools provides special religious education (SRE) and special education in ethics (SEE), where authorised teachers of approved providers are available. Bathurst Public School will provide parents/carers with the SRE/SEE participation letter at the time of enrolment. Parents should complete this and return it to the school with the enrolment forms. Parents/carers can, at any time, notify the school in writing that they wish to withdraw their child from SRE/SEE or to change their nomination. Children will continue in the same class as the previous year unless a parent/carer has requested a change.

CHECK-IN ASSESSMENTS

The Check-in assessment is an online reading and numeracy assessment for children in Years 3 to 9. The Check-in assessment windows for 2022 are:

Term 1 - Week 9 - For students in Years 4 and 6

Term 4 - Dates to be confirmed and year groups to be confirmed

Check-in assessment can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.
